### Nature Notes

Although we are in the middle of May, stepping outside this morning to feed the birds, it felt more like early March with a stiff northwest wind. It is just over a month until the longest day! Nature is very confused with plants flowering earlier than usual and now being chilled. I am sure many a nest with eggs or young, the birds responding to the early warmth in March, will have succumbed to the cold wet April that followed. It was also windy and nests high in trees or exposed places will have been blown away. I thought the tree sparrows in the nest box on the Scots pine were well into nest building and egg laying by mid April, but then came a period of quiet, eggs had probably been lost to the bad weather. Thankfully recently they have been very active so I reckon are now sitting on a new clutch. I have seen blackbirds and robins with beaks full of food, they come and collect meal worms and fat I put out for them on the patio wall flying off with purpose, a sure sign of young being fed. Not all early breeding failed; I saw a young robin feeding itself independently.

One 21st April I heard a cuckoo calling for the first time from woods above Shearwater, later than usual; in 2010 it was 15th April, 2011 8th April. 'Our' house martins arrived back late on 2nd May; in 2011 it was 23rd April, 2010 22nd April. However, I saw my first swifts earlier than usual on 28th April. Most years I see swifts here mid May, usually spotting them first in Warminster soaring high up feeding on insects attracted by the town's warmth. 'Our' swallows in the garage have settled in but, due to the cold and less insects, they are only just mating.

Several times in the late evening I have been lucky to see the badgers in the lane just as they are coming out of their sett to forage for the night. On 2nd May, I had some soggy peanuts from the feeders and thought the badgers would appreciate them. Just as I was about to scatter them at an entrance hole at low level I realised that I was being watched by a sow and at least three cubs on the bank above me. She shot off into the sett followed by all but one cub which stood peering at me before it too darted for safety. Last evening I think I saw the same sow with two cubs. I'd seen another at the sett, trundling down the lane in front of me foraging. As I walked on, the sow and cub shot past me high up on the bank heading back towards the sett leaving one cub behind; it hadn't seen mum and sibling go up the bank to pass me so it started for home at my level in the lane. It got near to me and stopped. I had frozen stock still but it seemed worried about passing me I turned my face away so it couldn't see the 'white' of my skin, it tore past me heading for the safety of the sett.

The hares are hidden by long grass now so the half dozen I saw last evening were on the tracks. I never tire of watching them; they seem to use their ears like semaphore. I also spotted two deer. The fawns will be being born and hidden in deep cover for protection. The wood is carpeted with bluebells, the yellow azaleas and delicate green of the beech trees make a walk there at this time of year a must.

## New Pumping Station

On 16th May staff involved in strategy, planning and engineering from Wessex Water (WW) came to the Upper Deverills Village Hall to answer questions about their infrastructure plans for the valley. These plans are part of a wider infrastructure design to supply the Salisbury area with water from Corfe Mullen. The meeting was very well attended with the people spilling outside; thank you to everyone who came. More details of the meeting will be posted on [www.monktondeverill.co.uk](http://www.monktondeverill.co.uk) where people can also leave their comments on the meeting and their response to Wessex Water's plans for the valley.

Wessex Water were left in little doubt as to the inadequacy of their approach to date, the need to re-site the pumping station and to genuinely consult with the community in future planning. WW confirmed that their initial approach (threatening compulsory purchase of 1.5 acres of Pub Ground) had not been ideal and made several apologies. They stated that, while they were currently in consultation with the AONB and Wiltshire Council to establish which of the five sites (all located in the Monkton Deverill valley, two of which are still in Pub Ground) they are currently considering would be preferred by those bodies, they would also consult with the communities concerned.

On **Wednesday 13th June** WW will be staging a one-day exhibition of their plans in detail at Longbridge Deverill Village Hall. Please do visit the hall so that you can give your feedback as this may be your last chance to have any say. The water company aims to apply for planning permission in the summer.

In light of the huge interest in this issue among villagers the Water Action Group, which has so far managed this campaign, is likely to be reformed. ## Wessex Water

We are investing almost £200m in building a water supply grid to ensure security of water supply to all customers. It will include 150km of transfer mains, 14 new service reservoirs and 22 new or refurbished pumping stations and comprise more than 20 individual schemes across Somerset, Wiltshire and Dorset. It will involve connecting a major part of the network from the north of Bournemouth, through Salisbury. Part of the Main scheme passes through the Deverills.

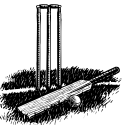
## Save the Children

## Falls Awareness Week 18th to 22nd June

### Did you know?

About 30% of people aged 65+ and 50% of people aged 80+ fall each year. 75% of falls are not reported. Falls destroy confidence, increase isolation and reduce independence. 9% of older people who fall become afraid to leave home in case they fall again. In the UK 1 in 2 women and 1 in 5 men will suffer a fracture at some point after the age of 50 because of poor bone health. About 300,000 fragility fractures occur each year in the UK.

### Enough of the bad news – what can we do about it?

Tailored exercise programmes can help reduce the risk of falling by improving strength and balance. Make sure your eyes are tested regularly and that you keep your glasses clean – if you can’t get out to an Optician it may be possible to arrange an eye test at home. Get rid of badly fitting slippers and shoes. Think about any risks in your home such as steps, stairs, poor lighting, trailing wires, rugs, uneven flooring etc. It might be possible to improve your safety at home with help from the local Home Improvement Agency.
