The Rector writes:

I have recently spent some time thinking about the many and varied aspects of my work, and I thought it might be interesting to share some of them with you.

I am often told (I hope with tongue in cheek!) that Sunday is my busy day. Leading worship on Sundays and at other times in the week feature large! Sunday Services must be prepared and sermons written. Hymns must be chosen, and a rota of services and service leaders organised. Leading worship in school [perhaps the biggest congregation of the week] and serving as a school governor are important aspects of my work each week.

There are always interesting opportunities for conversation when I meet people to prepare for baptisms and weddings, or to plan funeral services. It is a privilege to walk alongside those in distress, and to some degree, what I do will always be in response to particular needs. I also prepare people for confirmation, and facilitate discussion or study groups.

Ministry to the housebound may involve anything from a simple visit to taking Holy Communion to people in their homes. Encouraging others to explore how they might use their gifts in Christ's service is part of my role. Keeping oversight of the work we do with children and families is an exciting part of ministry, and working alongside the leaders of our Sunday School/Junior Church/Children's workshops is great. Issues surrounding safeguarding and child protection mean training for clergy and people alike. The oversight of churchyards and their regulations can be time-consuming. Then there are always requests for information and other correspondence to be dealt with, the monthly article to be written, and various events to be attended - not least of which are the Parochial Church Council Meetings.

I have Deanery and Diocesan commitments too, serving on the Deanery Standing Committee and Diocesan Synod. I value this additional dimension as it helps me see the work I do in a wider context.

And all this is held in the context of prayer, for the parish, for individuals, for the wider world. Keeping abreast of modern scholarship current issues is vital too, so I try to set time aside for that. There is also a need to find time to be reflective about ministry, the shape it takes and how best to live and work to God's praise and glory.

I hope this gives a flavour of the wonderful adventure that fills my life!

Projects initiated by Francesca seem to be going ahead well. The nursing college building is due to be finished by October. The Palliative Medicine project is making encouraging progress with genuine interest, so much so that a little building for a counselling centre can be built, the money to do this donated by a friend. The ultra sound machine is working again – another great help. Revd Agupio, who is chaplain to their bishop is also in charge of theological education, lives close to Francesca and is a great help to her; his eldest four children are trying to qualify for further education - an option unavailable when he was at school.

Francesca has been pleased to find that two Health Centres which had problems are now much better due to new staff and outside help. Francesca writes of Esther, the wife of a pastor who died 10 years ago, she is HIV positive and has been treated at the Médecins sans Frontières clinic in Arua (Uganda); she has a daughter called Gloria who is 11 years old. Esther acts as chaplain and helps with HIV patients when she is well enough and is greatly respected, please remember her in your prayers. Biswaza, a midwife, has advanced breast cancer, another courageous lady who, when she can afford it, has another course of chemotherapy. She continues to work in the Pharmacy and care for her husband and two children. Francesca thanks us for all our support and prayers.



Recipe of the Month

Sponsored by Maiden Bradley Community Shop (844206)

Lemon Surprise Pudding (serves 4)

2 eggs (separated)
50g (2oz) butter
100g (4oz) caster sugar
2 large lemons (rind and juice)
50g (2oz) self raising flour
Quarter pint milk
Cream or ice cream



Method

Grease a deep baking dish with butter and pre-heat oven at 180°C.

Beat butter, sugar and lemon rind together until well softened, then beat in the egg yolks, a little at a time. Fold in the flour, alternating with the milk and lemon juice. Whisk egg whites and fold in. Pour mixture into baking dish and bake in centre of oven for 40 – 45 minutes until golden brown.

Delicious served hot from oven with cream or ice cream.

You will need to try this recipe to find out what the surprise is!

Where have you been?

**The Weymouth Arms, 12 Elmwell Street, Warminster (01985 216995;
www.weymoutharms.co.uk)**

Jo Nelson, who has provided me with reliable tips in the past, told me there was a very good 'eating' pub in Warminster so I resolved to give it a try. Because of our other commitments, we usually go out for a midweek lunch; so one Wednesday in October found us looking for a parking space near The Weymouth Arms. If you are really lucky you can park on the street outside but we had to go into the car park outside The Minster School. We soon found out why. Despite it being midweek, the pub was really busy and had a great atmosphere. The Weymouth Arms is a sixteenth century private house which the present owners have renovated; they have kept some impressive stone fireplaces and cosy wood panelling but installed a state of the art kitchen which can be seen from one of the dining areas. Wireless broadband internet access is available throughout the inn.

There are three main dining areas plus a patio garden with a silver birch tree growing in the middle. As you enter the inn, there is a small dining room to the right where you can take your dog. The main dining areas are to your left; they consist of a large but cosy room next to the bar and a smaller, trendier area up a couple of steps towards the open kitchen. The clientele on the day we were there ranged from a family to an elderly man dining comfortably alone with the newspaper and a couple obviously having a business meeting. From the blurb I picked up in the pub I discovered that the chef had trained under two Michelin starred chefs (Michel Roux and Michael Caines). I don't feel our snack meals really put his skills to the test but both were tasty and well presented and at the going rate. I would definitely recommend you give it a try. The food and the atmosphere were very, very pleasant. Parking is a bit of an issue but the car park was relatively cheap (80p for two hours).




Wylve Valley Art Trail 2011 : Saturday 28th May - Sunday 5th June

Nick Andrew, founder and co-ordinator of the Wylve Valley Art Trail, is inviting artists and craftspeople to take part in the next Trail in 2011. A nine day festival of visual arts and crafts in and around the Wylve Valley, the Trail is the largest visual arts event in Wiltshire. Visitors can see artistic activities ranging from painting to printmaking, furniture making to photography and sculpture to ceramics. This will be the sixth event. Established in 2001, it takes place every other year. We aim to build on the success of the previous five Trails with a greater awareness of the range of art currently practised in the area. Get your chimney swept!

Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service would like to remind people about the importance of getting chimneys swept. The Service's advice is to ensure that chimneys for wood burning fires are swept every three months when in use. If you burn bituminous coal, the chimney should be cleaned at least twice a year, and at least once a year when burning smokeless coal. An annual clean is sufficient for oil and gas fires. Other safety tips include: have the chimney properly swept; make sure your fire receives enough air to allow the fuel to burn properly; only burn suitable fuels; do not overload the grate or appliance; maintain your appliance in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions; use a fire or spark guard to prevent accidental fires; inspect your chimney breast, particularly in the roof space, make sure that sparks or fumes cannot escape through cracks or broken bricks; make sure you are not at risk from carbon monoxide poisoning by having appliances installed and serviced by competent engineers; fit a carbon monoxide detector and never block air bricks, vents or flues; extinguish the fire before going to bed or leaving the house. Fireworks - be safe not sorry!

Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service say please follow the following safety code to ensure you have a happy and safe Bonfire Night celebration:

Only buy fireworks marked BS7114; keep fireworks in a closed box; follow the instructions on each firework; light at arms length, using a taper; stand well back; do not drink alcohol if setting off fireworks; never go near a lit firework, even if it has not gone off, it could still explode; never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them; always supervise children around fireworks; light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves; never give sparklers to a child under five; keep pets indoors; don't let off noisy fireworks after 11.00 pm; assess buildings and your surroundings.



Nature Notes

There are certain sights and sounds that make autumn for me. The most obvious is the change of colour of the leaves to the most gorgeous oranges, yellows, reds and browns particularly stunning on a bright sunny day. Then there are the fruits in the hedgerows; the red berries of the hawthorn, the sloes and the rosehips. As you walk along under the trees you tread on beech masts, acorns, conkers and hazelnuts. This year seems very good for most fruits.



Out walking recently I have seen squirrels busily collecting nuts for the winter. There seem to be more squirrels than usual this autumn; they must have had a good breeding season. I have also seen and heard a lot of jays who are also preparing for the winter collecting acorns. We have had Canada geese in one of the fields behind the farm, the field that had spring barley. I expect they have been attracted in by the shed grain. I counted 33 on several occasions, but now there are only 6. I seem to see more deer around at this time of the year, probably because their numbers are greatest now after the breeding season and the youngsters are bolder and out feeding alongside their mothers.

The sight and sound of game birds always says autumn to me; pheasants, red-legged partridges and the occasional grey partridge. We have got pheasants roosting again in the big beech hedge that wraps around the garden. The hedge gives them protection from the elements and from predation.

Birds flock together at this time of the year for reasons of safety and to find food. The most notable species to do this is the starling whose flocks can reach great numbers and are a real spectacle to watch. Pied wagtails also flock together. The other day we were out walking and came across several dozen feeding en masse on a newly worked field making the most of the food that had become available.

I always associate the call of long-tailed tits with this time of year. They move along in family groups often with other tit species calling all the time "pee pee pee". We have had them in the garden feeding on the peanuts. They are so sweet and very prettily marked.

Finally the sight and smell of fungi always says autumn to me. There have been some super toadstools up under the beeches and some mushrooms on the grass fields. It has been a bit drier this last week and so there has not been any new growth, but as soon as the dampness increases there will be new toadstools coming up.
