Hints and Tips

Underlining text

You can underline some text or word within your page content for emphasis.

To underline some text:

- Type <U> in front of the text/word you want to underline
- Type </U> at the end of the text/word

Example:

You can also **<U**>underline**</U>** some text or word for emphasis.

It would look like this on your web page: You can also <u>underline</u> some text or word for emphasis.

Creating a numbered list

You can use numbered lists for items which need to be followed in a specific order.

To create a numbered list:

- Type in front of the text you want to turn into a numbered list
- Type before each item you want to include in the list
- Type at the end of each item
- Type after the last item in the list

Your text is then displayed as a numbered list using 1, 2, 3, etc as the automatic numbering system.

Example:

You can use numbered lists for items which need to be followed in a specific order. ****

This is an item. This is another item. And this is the final item.

It would look like this on your web page:
